V. DEPARTMENT AND BUSINESS REPORTS

- a. Hazardous Reduction Progress Report: Hazard Reduction Coordinator Rogers reported that they have completed 21 properties and that we have enough properties to keep busy the rest of the summer. We have used the new trailer to haul 5 loads of debris. We have purchased a new weedeater, and chain saw sharpener. Chief Corbet reported that Shasta Regional Foundation notified us that we were rewarded a grant from Redding Rancheria in the amount of \$5000 for the purchase of a dump trailer. Since we already received a grant and purchased the trailer, they agreed to redirect the funds to other needed equipment for Hazard Reduction. Chief Corbett is working on a list of needed items. Commissioner Owen asked about the fuel break on Lance Gulch and Chief Corbett reported that no work is being done.
- b. Chief's Report: Chief Corbett report that:
 - i. One of the engines was pulled out of the bay with equipment door open. Both the building and engine took damage, but both are being fixed.
 - ii. He did a day care reinspection
 - iii. CalFire has placed the burn ban in effect as of yesterday
 - iv. We have been getting busier including a large RV fire. He commended the crews who responded. The fire was put out quick.

- c. Fire Department Report: Chief Corbett reported that:
 - i. The fireworks and the Bar-B-Q fundraiser went well. Helsley commended Covid-19 restrictions that were in place for the Bar-B-Q fundraiser. Some of the Commissioner echoed his statement all agreeing that is was a great event. They expressed appreciation for doing the July 4th celebration.
 - ii. We have run to-date 246 calls with no change in responder numbers.
 - iii. Training will resume tomorrow with Coronavirus restrictions in place
 - iv. There are six new Explorer members and they have been training. The Post is being managed by Captain Brown and it is going well.
