Regular Meeting - July 2, 2019

- I. CALL TO ORDER: The Regular Meeting of the Weaverville Fire Protection District was called to order by Commissioner Bill Fischer at 1001 hours. Commissioners present: Larry Helsley, George Owen, and Bill Briton. Commissioners Absent: Rick Wetzel. Others present: Fire Chief Todd Corbett, Assistant Chief Henry Boorman, Hazard Reduction Coordinator Kayla Gaulke, and Administrative Officer Serena Brown.

- a. Hazardous Reduction Progress Report: Hazard Reduction Coordinator K. Gaulke reported that we have completed 18 jobs and that we have used about 60% of our Title III budget. Chief Corbett did a presentation for the Trinity County Board of Supervisors and for Trinity County Realtors. We can reapply for more Title III funding soon. Trinity County RCD has obtained a Cal Fire grant to do Fuels Reduction in the area of West Weaverville including Weaver Bally Loop and some parts of Oregon Street.
- b. Fire Chief's Report: Chief Corbett reported that:
- We budgeted new tires for 2112 and he would like to get them on right away
- K. Gaulke, S. Brown and himself went to Trinity High School for recruitment
- TCSO, Cal Fire, OES and WFD had a meeting and Trinity County is following new evacuation procedures
 including standardize terminology

- c. Fire Department Report: Assist. Chief Boorman reported that
 - We are to-date at 273 calls
 - We have 22 members
 - Mahlon Cleveland has moved to Montana
 - The members have been very busy attending local events including (but not limited to) a Water Funday for WES, took Engine 3 and 7 to the Car Show, and helped setup THS graduation.
 - The meeting room renovation is going good we have finished the floors and have a new window installed.
 - The July 4th Pancake breakfast and bar-b-q with open house is coming up and we hope to recruit some new members.
- d. Sleeper Program Report: Corbett reported on behalf of the sleepers the Station 2 HVAC is installed and signed off. We will be getting a rebate on our TPUD bill.
- e. Committee Reports

Commissioner Owen asked about the status of the pump rebuild invoice with there being nothing to report on the matter. The Board unanimously agreed that the meeting room is looking good and commended Boorman for work done on the floor.
