

MINUTES WEAVERVILLE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

Regular Meeting - July 6, 2023

- I. CALL TO ORDER: The Regular Meeting of the Weaverville Fire Protection District was called to order by Chairman Rick Wetzel at 1000 hours. Commissioners present: Larry Helsley, George Owen, and Todd Watkins. Commissioners absent: Bill Fischer. Others present: Assistant Chief Henry Boorman, Fire Chief Todd Corbett, and Admin Officer Serena Brown.

 - iv. There was a fire near Lee Fong Park, and it went smooth. Wetzel commented that the community is very thankful for a job well done. Cal Fire arrested someone for an escape transient fire.
- c. Fire Department Report: Assistant Chief Boorman reported that:
 - i. We have to-date ran 276 calls and we have 26 members
 - ii. We attended many community events including a 'water day' at WES for last day of school, assisted with THS graduation set up and stood by at the Sober Graduation, took E7 to the Historic Car Show, and had a booth at the Pride Festival
 - iii. Participated in several interagency training courses including the Wildland Fire Preparedness drill in the Trinity Center/Coffee Creek area and hosted a helicopter hoist training.

- iv. Helped with many July 4th type activities including the Lions Club clean and prep of the Lowden Park, stood by for the Golf Ball drop, Bull Ride, Water Day in the Park, Destruction Derby, Fireworks, and did our Hamburger Fundraiser.
- v. Directors gave kudos to Larry Brown and the Explorer program for all the work they did including helping setup the Ice Cream Social
